Holy Eucharist and the Family as School of Love

It is such a great blessing that I write this message conveying my Christmas message and blessing to you all as your National Spiritual Chaplain, but really, as your fellow pilgrim thanking God for the gift of the Holy Family in our lives of Faith!

This season and for this reason, I invite you to reflect on the purpose of being family. In God's plan, the family is supposed to be a "school of love" in which every member is loved and inspired to give of oneself in love to others; with Jesus, Mary and Joseph as our models for this "school of love".

As much as Joseph and Mary are the parents of Jesus, the Son of God, they were also ordinary people who followed traditional customs and complied with the laws of their nation. They raised Jesus as any normal parents would raise their son. They taught Him and disciplined Him. Jesus probably had to do daily chores and learn basic education like any other boy living in Nazareth. Joseph had to work hard for a living and Mary did her share of the housework.

This ordinary life as a family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus make them role models for any modern Christian family. And they led a typical family life that is distinctly enveloped by love, responsibility and care for each other.

We definitely have read and heard of the difficulties and challenges of the family in the 21stcentury. Maybe we have experienced these difficulties ourselves. As parents or grandparents, you perhaps worry how our children or grandchildren would grow up or how you can continue instilling Catholic values in the home. You are anxious about the people in their school and the larger society and what influence they have on your loved one's behavior.

At a time when many families are breaking up and breaking down all over, the Holy Family presents itself as our source of great hope and consolation. There is perhaps no other way to keep each family intact and moving onwards except through the virtue of sheer self-sacrifice and self-giving for each other in the family. Think of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph and their commitment to each other despite all their difficulties, and trust that your families, too, can weather and hurdle any challenge or obstacle that may come your way. It takes care, responsibility, and most of all – love.

As you gather at the Christmas table after you have attended your Christmas Mass together as a family, embrace the simple truth and boundless opportunity to make your homes, the domestic church, truly a "school of love". I charge you, my dear Catholic Daughters of the Americas, together with your spouses, to imitate Christ's love for His bride – the Church, sacrificing for each other to make the other holy. For any marriage to thrive, for any family to thrive, spouses need to come together to the Holy Eucharist where they will receive the Lord of love inside them and be able to share His complete and total love with each other.

For our JCDA, learn from the example of your parents who strive to model their lives after the example of Mary and Joseph – a task that is not easy, but possible only through your collaboration and response borne out of love; because ultimately, what you do with your parents, you do for God who gave you your parents to make tangible His love and providence for you, His dear children!

To the crisis of the family we recognize the world and the Church face today, God has given a solution: Holy the Eucharist, the "school of love". Gather in the Holy Eucharist on Sunday and holy days of obligations, and as frequent as you are able, to receive Jesus - bring Him home and allow Him to be shared to others out of care, responsibility, and love.

Advent is a time to reflect on the family and your faith. I know as a child my family always did an advent wreath, but I never knew really why the tradition and what it meant. I did some looking on the internet and found some interesting facts. I have listed a few below and since advent is a time for family, I have listed 12 fun activities that can be done as a family.

Why is 1 pink and 3 purple?

A tradition is that each week represents 1,000 years – (representing) the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the birth of the Savior. "Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles symbolize the prayer, penance and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time.



The church has traditionally assigned four virtues to each of the four Sundays in Advent: hope, peace, joy, and love.

Why is Joy candle pink?

Gaudete Sunday is similar to the Lenten Laetare Sunday, which also represents joy and falls at the midpoint of Lent. And that finally leads to the explanation for the pink candle. In the ancient Church on Laetare Sunday in Lent, the Pope gave a citizen a pink rose.

What is the symbolism of the wreath?

Eventually, the branches were shaped into wreaths, symbols of joy and victory in classical times. The evergreen wreath - its circular shape an emblem not only of perfection and unity but also of the warm, enduring sun - later became a Christian symbol for Christ's suffering and ultimate triumph over death.

What do the red berries represent in advent

In the Christian tradition, red berries on an Advent wreath symbolize the blood of Jesus Christ that was shed for the salvation of humanity

Did you know this about a candy cane?

The candy cane holds beautiful symbolism related to Jesus' birth and sacrifice on the cross. Shaped like a shepherd's crook, it signifies Jesus as the Good Shepherd who guides and protects his flock. The white color represents the purity and innocence of his birth, while the red stripes symbolize the blood shed on the cross for our redemption. When inverted, the candy cane forms the letter "J" for Jesus. Hang candy canes on your Christmas tree as a visual reminder of these meaningful messages. Then gather as a family and read the Nativity Story from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Luke's Gospel highlights the role of the shepherds and their encounter with the newborn Jesus!

Christmas Greetings CDA Sisters!

Let us talk about Advent, Christmas and....you guessed it.....Lithuanians.

Advent means "coming" or "arrival." It is a time of waiting and preparation, filled with joy but also with repentance and penance. It anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the nativity in Bethlehem, Christ's reception in the heart of the believer, and the return of Christ at His Second Coming.

Advent has existed from about 480. Bishop Perpetuus of Tours, who died in 490, ordered that the faithful fast three times a week from St. Martin's Day, November 11th, until Christmas Day. This rule's degree of strictness changed several times over the centuries. **Finally, the Second Vatican Council, in order to differentiate the spirit of Advent from that of Lent, emphasized that Advent was a season of hope—the promise of Christ's Second Coming.**

I am proud to say that my lineage is Lithuanian – a country deeply rooted in Roman Catholicism. It had been the main faith of Lithuania since the 15th century. Almost 75% of the population is Catholic. There are several miraculous paintings in Vilnius, Lithuania, including the Divine Mercy – the namesake of **Court Daughters of Divine Mercy**, **#2753 in Clovis, California.** The painting by Kazimierowski is based on visions received by the Lithuanian, Sister Faustina Kowalska. Many miracles have been attributed to the painting - a conduit for grace and a vessel of mercy.

A major site of Catholic pilgrimage in Lithuania is the Hill of Crosses. Religion was forbidden during the Soviet occupation of Lithuania. People were not allowed to honor the dead, so they placed crosses and crucifixes on the hill. The Soviet government would tear the crosses down and persecute the pilgrims, but soon the crosses would spring up again, restoring the number to hundreds and thousands. In 2007 the number surpassed 200,000.

In Lithuania, Advent is a time of abstinence and Christmas is a time of strong Catholic experience. Even today, many traditions are still observed. I want to share some of their culture because it is rich with symbolism and saturated with prominence.

Christmas Eve is more celebrated than Christmas itself. It is a day of fasting and dry abstinence meaning not only no meat, but also no dairy products or eggs. The family gathers to eat a special supper that must include at least 12 meals in honor of the twelve apostles.

Straw is spread on the dining table and then covered with a clean, white tablecloth in memory of the manger where the Child Jesus was placed after his birth. Family members pull a piece of straw from under the tablecloth and believe that if it is long, they will have a long life; if it is short they will have a short life; and a thick straw means a rich and happy life!

In the center of the table is Holy Communion decorated with images of the Nativity of Jesus sold in churches and blessed by priests.

The table is decorated with candles and small branches from a fir tree. Dinner begins when the first stars can be seen in the night sky. If it is cloudy, the head of the house decides when the meal starts. Dinner begins with a prayer, and then Communion. Everyone starts with a separate wafer, breaks it and offers it to another while blessing them and wishing them something for the coming year. Sometimes an apple is cut and shared by all present as a reminder of the apple eaten in the Garden of Eden.

Often an extra place is set for a family member who cannot come or for a family member who died during the year. Some believe their deceased relatives join the family round the table. The table remains untouched during the night so that the souls of the departed can feast.

Perhaps you would like to begin a new tradition this year with incorporating one of these Catholic traditions. I like the idea of 12 dishes representing the 12 Apostles and sharing Communion while "blessing" the family member for the upcoming year.

A Tale for Advent (Author unknown)

Four candles burned peacefully, and slowly melted. It was so quiet that one could hear them talking.

The first candle said, "I am Peace. Unfortunately, people do not know how to care for me. I guess I have nothing left but extinction!" And the flame of that candle went out.

The second candle said, "I am Faith. Unfortunately, no one needs me. People do not want to know anything about me, so it does not make sense for me to keep burning." As soon as it was said, a light breeze stirred and blew out the candle.

A very sad third candle spoke, "I am Love. I no longer have the strength to burn any longer. People do not appreciate or understand me. They hate those who love them the most – your relatives." After a long wait, the candle went out.

Suddenly – a child entered the room and saw three extinguished candles.

Frightened, he exclaimed, "What are you doing? You have to burn – I am afraid of the dark!" And when he had spoken, he wept.

The excited fourth candle said, "Do not be afraid or cry. While I am burning, we can always ignite the other three candles. I am Hope.

With shining eyes full of tears, the child took candle Hope and lit the others. Let hope never to be extinguished in our hearts. **And, like the child, we should all let Hope guide us.**

Wishing you all a vigilant and abstinent Advent, a Christ-filled Christmas, and a year abounding with faith, peace and hope.
